SUMMER REVISION GUIDELINES

Please find below a suggested timetable and guidelines for revision purposes over the summer holidays. Summer revision is essential. Your child has been working hard and it is important not to lose the vital skills or the ability to work within a set time learned over the past academic year. This is why summer revision is vital to prevent summer learning loss.

Summer Learning Loss

What exactly is summer learning loss? Summer learning loss is when children return to school after their summer holidays at a lower academic level than the end of the last academic school year. During the summer holidays of your child's Year 5, we still need their learning to accelerate and develop. Studies show that summer learning loss can be anywhere between one to three months of study. It is more pronounced in reading and maths and anywhere from 20 – 50% of skills can be lost over the summer months. It is, therefore, essential to embark upon an 11+ summer revision programme to enable your child to be competitive in the 11+ test.

You child will get the most out of a summer revision programme if you:

- 1. Plan the topics**
 - a. Work on accuracy**
 - b. Work on timing**
 - c. Encourage effective learning**
- 2. Organise your child's learning**
 - a. Create a timetable**
- 3. Make sure they are involved in a range of activities.**
 - a. Schedule other activities**
 - b. Keep motivation high**
- 4. Revise English and Verbal Reasoning**
- 5. Revise Maths**
- 6. Revise Non-Verbal Reasoning**

1. PLAN THE TOPICS

a. Work on Accuracy



How well does your child know the topics of the 11+ programme? It may be useful to look at their results from their assessment tests and homework to think about strengths and target areas. Your child's teacher will have also talked to you about these in your feedback calls over the past academic year. Over the summer holidays, it is important to work on all aspects of a subject and not just the target areas. Strengths need to remain as strengths.

Encourage your child to think about their strengths and target areas as outlined below. A child's own self-assessment can help them to take responsibility for their learning. To help with this process, they can think about whether they would award themselves a gold (they can do most of the questions), a silver (they need a bit more help) or bronze medal (they still need to do more work in this area to increase accuracy). Target areas can change as revision progresses.

b. Work on Timing



It is important to not only work on developing accuracy but also timing. Not all work needs to be timed. It may be that a 50/50 split (or other) will help to improve both accuracy and timing when your child is working on 11+ revision. Your child needs to be able to get as many questions right as possible but also complete the questions in the allocated time. Revising in short bursts can be very productive but longer periods of study will also be required as your child will be sitting an 11+ test which is administered in two 60 minute sessions. Using more formal papers will help with this part of 11+ revision. It is important to use the GL papers as they are the examination board. The use of longer papers is important not only for working for longer periods of study but also to use both questions papers and answer booklets as this is what your child will do in the real 11+ test. It is important to reinforce that working out is completed in the question papers but only answers can be shaded in the answer booklet. No annotations or working out are allowed in the answer booklet.

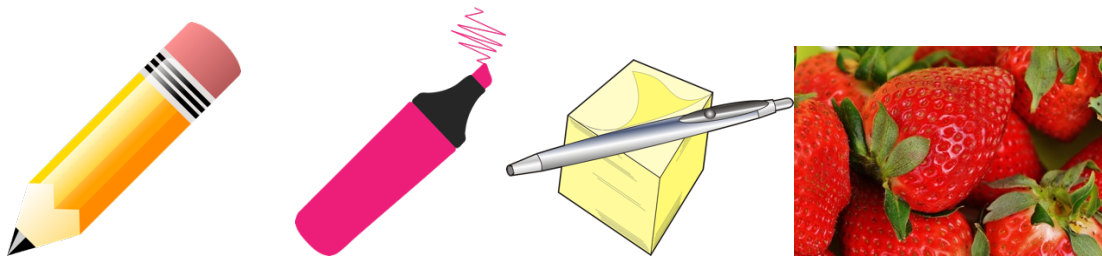
If your child finds it difficult to complete all the questions in time or races through with a lot of time to spare, then they need help with timings. Look at the questions they find difficult and prohibit them from completing the test. Initially, encourage them to skip the questions which are slowing them down. They can always return to complete them when they have

time at the end of the section. In this way they get to see all the questions and have more chance of spending time on the easier ones before tackling the more difficult ones. Your child knows this strategy as “Find a Friend.” The topic areas or question types that they find more difficult can also be practised during their target area time.

If your child is finding that they are completing the tests well ahead of schedule then make sure they are actively checking their work to maximise their score and eliminate unnecessary errors. You can also reduce the time allocated for the test to put them under a bit more time pressure as this will test their decision making as they work through the test. Can they beat the publisher but still maintain high levels of accuracy?

It is important to use textbooks and timed tests of different lengths and from different publishers – GL, CGP, 11+ Essentials and Collins. Shorten or extend the time allocated for the test so the children aren't working to the same timings and have the opportunity to vary their work speeds. Timed tests don't always need to be timed as they can also be used for improving accuracy. It is all about balancing work on accuracy and timing according to your child's needs.

c. Learn Effectively



- Encourage your child to jot down important learning points and methods down to help them remember.
- Certain foods can help the brain.
- Regular breaks help to sustain motivation and increase productivity.
- Encourage your child to highlight key words to help them read questions accurately and promote understanding of what is required.
- Mind maps can help to retain information.
- Study on the go using flashcards, if required.
- Keep all skills sharp. Strengths and target areas all need to be topped up. Study with breadth as only a limited number of questions can be tested.

2. ORGANISE YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING

Our children have generally completed one to two hours 11+ revision per day Monday to Friday in recent years. Timetables can make revision much easier to achieve.

a. Create a Timetable

It is important to break revision down in to small manageable chunks as well as providing longer periods of study. Working on all 11+ areas and not solely on target areas is crucial. Strengths need to remain as strengths.

- Create specific times for target areas and to work on all other areas.
- Remember to work on both accuracy and timing.
- Target areas may change as revision progresses.
- Plan week by week or day by day (whichever works best for your child).
- Create a visual representation of your child's timetable with post it notes, chalkboards and whiteboards. The post it notes can be thrown away when an activity is completed or moved around when flexibility is required.
- Removing and rubbing out work completed is motivating as it shows your child that they are making progress.
- A visual representation can also help to build in flexibility so that if something good comes up a piece of work can be moved to another day but a record of what needs to be completed by the end of the week is still clear.
- Create a timetable for other activities so that your child can see they are having balance and enjoying other activities too.

Suggested Summer Revision Timetable

The timetables below are suggestions as to how you may structure this time but not prescriptive. I have allocated slightly more time to VR and Maths as there are new elements of VR due to the change to the GL testing format and Maths has a large amount of content but this may not be suitable for your child and will need to be varied..

3. MAKE SURE THEY ARE INVOLVED IN A RANGE OF ACTIVITIES



Make sure your child is well rested and has fun. It is the summer holidays. Schedule in play dates, physical exercise, TV time, game time and other favourite activities. Breaking up work with physical exercise (walking, riding a bike, ball games), listening to music, colouring, art projects, watching films, meeting friends and playing will all create balance.

a. Keep Motivation High



Keeping motivation as high as possible is difficult but very important. Children who are more motivated to learn persist longer, produce a higher quality effort, learn more deeply and perform better in tests.

- Reward diligence and commitment, not just accuracy.
- Vary work so that it reinforces as well as extends. Balance easier and harder work. A hard question and easy question are allocated the same marks so getting the easy marks is important too.
- Work on corrections to clear up misunderstandings so that your child doesn't repeat errors.
- Make it easy think for them to complete their revision. Think about set up. Work in a quiet place without any distractions. Keep work , pencils and other materials in one place so everything is at hand.
- Make sure they're not hungry or thirsty so that they can concentrate properly.
- Create a study plan together and think about how much time needs to be allocated and when the work will be completed. What time works best. How often will there be a break and for how long?
- Give rewards to look forward to once 11+ work is finished. For example, points could be collected each day or study period to use for something special.

b. Focus on Positives



- Set small achievable goals such as
 - I will read a chapter of my book every day
 - I will complete a proofreading spelling passage every day
 - I will learn two/three new words every day
 - I will complete two fraction questions each day
 - I will do my 11+ work first thing in the morning
- Identify what work went really well. Encourage your child to think of all the questions they got right. Keeping a list is a great way to for your child to identify their strengths and for them to know their easy questions.

Let's have a look at each subject in detail to help you and your child identify strengths and target areas by allocating gold, silver and bronze medals to each subject area and nominating a target area or two for each section. It is also a good idea to tick each item with your child that they are competent at or pleased with. This is motivating.

d. English and Verbal Reasoning

English Comprehension – understanding the text, fact retrieval, finding information in the passage, word meanings, reasoning questions, inference, prediction, summarising, text structure, multiple statement questions – true or false

English Proofreading – locating spelling mistakes and punctuation mistakes, complete sentences without grammatical errors

Verbal Reasoning

Making new words - missing letters, moving letters, hidden words, missing words, use a rule to make a new word, compound words, complete word pairs, anagrams, word ladders

Word meanings – synonyms, antonyms, multiple meanings, odd ones out, word connections.

Verbal Reasoning

Sequencing – complete the sum, letter and number sequences, related numbers, letter-coded sums

Coding and logic – letter connections, letter and number-word codes, logical reasoning

ENGLISH COMPREHENSION

Working on Accuracy

Regular reading is extremely important but it doesn't have to be just books. Newspapers and magazines can also be used to summarise and pick out the key points about articles and passages. Reading comprehension accuracy is enhanced with fluent reading skills. Children need good reading skills to succeed at comprehension exercises. Reading a variety of authors is key to understanding different writing styles. It also promotes an understanding of how sentences are linked together, helps with processing, reading speed and understanding.

The three books below are particularly good for working on accuracy. The first book covers a range of questions including specific questions and sections that work on fact retrieval, word meanings, inference, prediction, summarising and text structure. This makes it easy to work on very specific target areas and track progress. The second and third book enables children to practise looking for key words when scanning for answers; an invaluable skill.

VERBAL REASONING

Working on Accuracy

Use any of the flashcards, vocabulary books or general VR books to increase accuracy but the two recommendations below are good to help children learn vocabulary to help make new words and identify word meanings. Vocabulary cartoons can help to increase the number and variety of mental associations to help learn new words. When new words are learned in context, such as in a picture, it is easier to remember them. Vocabulary cards can be versatile to use on the move and to help present vocabulary in a different format. Working on vocabulary is best when it is done little and often so also make use of word searches, crossword puzzles, spidergrams, a thesaurus and playing games (like Scrabble and Bananagram). Using vocabulary is important. Focusing on learning two or three new words a day and using them regularly will be more effective rather than completing lots of vocabulary exercises but never using the words.

e. MATHS

Allocating gold, bronze and silver medals to each subject area and nominating a target area or two for each section from the objectives below will help to plan your child's maths revision. Which areas still need sharpening up? It is also a good idea to tick each item with your child that they are competent at or pleased with. It is important to keep your child's strengths in maths at a high level too. This is motivating.

Number/Calculation - place value & rounding, negative numbers, use standard written methods for all four operations, confidently add and subtract mentally, use BODMAS, identify factors, multiples & primes, use square and cube numbers, solve multi-step number problems

Algebra– understand simple use of unknowns

Geometry and Measures– Use a range of measures and conversions, calculate area of triangles, rectangles and composite shapes, classify shapes by properties, know and use angle rules, translate & reflect shapes using all four quadrants

Data Handling - interpret tables, line graphs and pie charts, solve questions about data

FPD – Compare and order fractions, add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions, write decimals as fractions, order & round decimal numbers, link percentages to fractions & decimals, solve FPD problems

Working on accuracy:

Jotting down workings when mathematical problems are more complicated is really important as they require more than just mental ability. Working out helps to organise thoughts so it is important to encourage your child to show their workings, where appropriate. This is particularly important with maths as it is a step-by-step process and writing down steps helps children to understand where to go next. If children always try to do working out in their head, they may skip some steps because they have trouble visualising the whole problem as they are spending all their capacity working out calculations. Writing it all down helps them to visualise what comes next and reduce cognitive load. This, in turn, will help to eliminate errors. It is definitely worth going over questions your child gets wrong and explaining how to get the right answer. They can often self-correct questions themselves too.

From the books below, the CGP GL Maths Practice Book, Study Book and Question Book are focused on specific topics to develop understanding and confidence, with a range of questions for each topic. The SATSPAPERSGUIDE website is also excellent as it segments question types by maths topics. It can help to focus on individual key areas for maths so that your child can do lots of work on one particular topic. The KS3 SATs papers are also useful as they contain lots of mixed up questions to aid accuracy. They are also both free.

f. NON-VERBAL REASONING

Help your child identify strengths and target areas by allocating gold, silver and bronze medals to each subject area and nominating a target area or two for each section. It is also a good idea to tick each item with your child that they are competent at or pleased with. This is motivating.

2D NVR – Complete the series, odd one out, analogies, rotations, reflections, matrices (grids), find the figure that is identical, hidden figures, pattern addition and subtraction, codes

3D NVR – Plan views, composite shapes, 3D views, nets and cubes, paper folding and hole punching

Working on accuracy:

Even if you think your child may have a natural talent for NVR and be able to spot the answer without necessarily being able to explain how they worked it out, it is still a good idea for them to consider how they found their answers. This will help them to develop strategies for more complex questions and reduce the risk of them making careless mistakes. If NVR does not come so naturally to your child, the required skillset can be cultivated through helping them to familiarise themselves with the variety of NVR question types they may face, taking care to note what to look out for and which techniques are needed for which question type. It is important to make sure that your child works on both 2D and 3D NVR question types. Using the process of elimination is important as it reduces the number of remaining possible answers. For the vast majority of questions, SPANSS is also extremely effective. It is a mnemonic which stands for:

- Shape
- Position
- Angle
- Number
- Size
- Shading
